

SELECTMEN'S MESSAGE

Office Hours: Monday 7:00 pm - 9:00 pm

- It has been a great year in the Selectmen's office. We have been
 working on policies and procedures that make our accounting and
 communications with the Treasurer, Town Clerk, Tax Collector and
 others faster and more accurate. Also, we have made
 improvements to some forms and applications such as Building
 Permits, Exemption Requests, Welfare Guidelines and a new
 Corrective Action form used to handle grievances of all kinds.
- 2. We need to remind you that 2012 is the year that our full revaluation of property is due to be done. It is the State law that requires it to be done every 5 years. We have mixed feelings about this and tried at one point to see if we really needed to do this but found that it is mandatory. It is required to have an accurate assessment of your property and this update should reflect the change we have seen in real estate in the last 5 years.
- 3. The Joslin Road bridge project finally got under way after a long permitting and engineering process delayed our hopes of having it completed in 2011. The bridge will be completed this spring.
- 4. The Town had an unexpected loss of revenue when Massachusetts and Connecticut decided not to pay their share of the Flood Control that Surry provides. Last year the State of New Hampshire paid their portion for them which amounted to \$75,000. We are working hard to regain this revenue and it will be a top priority in 2012.
- Renovations on the Town Hall's south side continued in 2011. We have had nothing but compliments with the results so far. The plan is to do a little renovation each year until the exterior of the Hall is completed. We would like to have the Town Hall looking its best for Surry's 250th birthday in 2019.

- 6. A big thank you to Fred Bretton for his dedication, commitment, hard work and service to the Town. Fred, who wants to keep us all safe, helped us this year with renaming the North Mine Ledge Road to Farm Road when it became evident that some confusion could result from having two roads in town with similar names (South Mine Ledge Road) when 911 emergency responders are dispatched. When the fire trucks are headed out we want no doubt as to where they are going. This is an effort to cut response times, saving lives and property. Fred didn't stop there; he also created a complete Emergency Plan for the town which we have adopted. This plan provides guidance and procedure in the event of a major disaster either natural or domestic. Combining Fred's work with the work of Russ Fiorey and the safety committee we continue to make Surry a safe place to live, work and gather.
- 7. We are in the process of finding a new mapping company to keep our printed town maps up to date. Our old company, Dollard, is no longer in business. The mapping companies now all use a digital format to generate the maps which means our data will have to be converted to digital when we find a new company.
- 8. The fire truck will be paid off in 2012.
- 9. The ceiling upstairs at the Town Hall has been repaired and painted thanks entirely to the Surry Players.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE – TOWN OF SURRY COUNTY OF CHESHIRE

TOWN WARRANT – 2012

To the inhabitants of the Town of Surry, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Surry on Tuesday, the 13th of March, 2012 from 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. to cast written ballots to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers as listed on the official ballot.
- 2. Are you in favor of clarifying and therefor changing the definition of an Accessory Dwelling Unit in the Town Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Planning Board and presented at public hearing? The Article II, B. Accessory Dwelling definition will change from "Such a unit may be no larger than 600 square feet in area" to: "Such a unit will be no larger than 600 square feet of living space, additionally the total area of all porches/decks/etc. combined can be no larger than 30 percent of the accessory dwelling living area. No third floors on self-standing buildings." Thus, creating a need for a definition for *Living Area* in the Town Ordinance, Article II which will read: All heated, conditioned area, calculated by using all exterior dimensions as follows; 100% of primary floor, 100% of second floor with full walls, 75% of second floor with full dormer or dog house dormer, 55% of second floor with 5 foot or lower knee walls, 40% of second floor with tent style (no knee walls).

In addition, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Surry on Thursday, the 15th of March, 2012 for the business meeting at 7:00 p.m. to act on the following articles:

3. To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees.

- 4. Are you in favor of changing the distribution of funds from the current use penalty as specified in RSA 79-A, Land Use Change Tax, as recommended by the Planning Board? Funds received would be disbursed 75 percent to the General Fund and 25 percent to the Conservation Commission instead of 100 percent to the Conservation Commission as it is applied now. If adopted this article shall take effect April 1, 2012 and shall remain in effect until altered or rescinded by a future vote of the Town meeting. (Majority vote required).
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, to the extent it has not already been discontinued, the Class 6 portions of the road known as Wilbur Road, as provided for in RSA 231:43, or to take any action in relation thereto. The section of Wilbur Road that is the subject of this article is described thus: from a point east of the boundary of land owned by Barbara Patnode, through the Graff Town Forest, across the land of Tom and Julia Dutton, abutted by land of Lawrence and Kathleen Sportello, abutted by land of Alexander and Wendy Prescott, across Route 12A, across the land of Mark and Kathleen Gross to a point where it intersects Surry Dam Road. The purpose of this article is to clarify the legal status of the road and to vote for the complete discontinuance of the above mentioned portion of Wilbur Road. The Conservation Committee recommends this article. (Majority vote required)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to place into the ongoing capital reserve fund for Highway Equipment, or take any action in relation thereto. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to place into the ongoing expendable trust fund known as the Town Hall and Carriage Shed Maintenance Fund, for the purpose of repairing and maintaining the town hall and attached carriage shed, or take any action in relation thereto. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,000 for the purpose of making road improvements, or take any action in relation thereto. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3,000 to place into the Financial Audit Expendable Trust Fund, for the purpose of paying for

- a future financial audit of the town, or take any action in relation thereto. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to place into the Fire Station Exhaust Extraction Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of acquiring and installing an exhaust extraction system at the fire station, or take any action in relation thereto. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required.)
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$397,323 for general municipal operations, or take any action in relation thereto. This total does not include warrant articles addressed individually. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required.)
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SURRY PLANNING BOARD 2011 Year in Review

January: Regular Meeting

Discussed the Master Plan update and reviewed past questionnaire.

February Regular Meeting

March: No Meeting

April: Regular Meeting

Nominated/Elected Planning Board Positions: Pete Bissell/Chairman, Eric Eichner/Secretary. John Berglund appointed to fill the rest of Jason Walter's term. A lot line adjustment application for Bruce Anderson's properties on Old Walpole Road(lots 5-97 & 5-97b) was submitted, Public Hearing set for May 23rd 2011.

May: Regular Meeting

Visited the need for a laptop for the planning board-the plan is for the secretary (Eric) to actually accomplish this task before next meeting.

Public hearing for a lot line adjustment for Bruce Anderson, lots 5-97 & 5-97b was opened at 7:30pm. Hearing was closed at 7:51pm. planning board approved the lot line adjustment request.

We revisited the on-going Master Plan update-working on developing a survey/questionnaire to see what residents like/want/think about where Surry is and should go in the future in regards to planning.

June: Regular Meeting

Fired up the Planning Board laptop donated by Steve Ryder.

Worked on composing a thank you letter for the computer.

Fran and Elwood Streeter stopped by to discuss a subdivision of their land on Webster road/Route 12a-taking one of his lots and create two or three lots(minor sub division.)

Discussed the need for a new alternate member of the planning board as our last one(John Berglund)is now a regular member .

July: Regular Meeting

Oneil Jay Fish came in and asked to fill our Alternate Planning Board member vacancy. We agreed to bring him on. Further discussed the ongoing Master plan update.

Discussed the setback for surface water to the septic system of 100' to possibly return the setback to 75'(which is State rule) and have a dual chamber tank in the system for better effluent processing before the effluent goes to the leeching area.

The idea behind this is to open up some (building) lots in town that otherwise may not be able to have a septic system designed to fit properly. Pete is going to work on the wording of this proposal.

John brought up the current use tax money that goes to the conservation commission rule, and changing it to split the money between the conservation commission and the general fund. The Board created a proposal and submitted it to the selectman's office to get it on the ballot this coming year.

August: Regular Meeting

Construction and operation approval for David Lawrence's septic system on pond road was received.

Reviewed the revision proposal for Zoning Ordinance article VII "D" . We will set a date for the public hearing at our next scheduled meeting.

Discussed the wording that may be used to clarify accessory dwelling square footage definition.(Article II "B")

Jay Fish was sworn in by the town clerk and is now an official alternate member of the planning board.

The Select Board referred Nancy Balla to see the Planning board about the possibility of an accessory dwelling on her property on route 12A(#506).

September: Regular Meeting

Discussed Accessory dwelling definitions/regulations again:

Article II

B;(last line changed to:) Such a unit should be no larger than 600 Square feet of living area, additionally the total area of all porches/decks/etc can be no larger than 25% of the accessory dwelling living area.

Living Area Definition; Primary level: square footage of all finished, four season heated space as calculated by using exterior dimensions. Additional levels are calculated by interior floor space.

We will contact a couple appraisers to find out how they calculate living area.

October: Regular Meeting

Discussed Accessory dwelling definitions/regulations again:

Public hearing will be November 28th @ 7:30pm to discuss a clarification of the accessory dwelling definition relative to Article II B and to add a definition of "living area"

November: Regular Meeting/Public Hearing

Nancy Balla had a question about accessory dwelling addressing for 911. Public Hearing held for: Proposed clarification of the accessory dwelling definition relative to Article II B of the Surry Zoning Ordinance and to add a definition of "living area"

Nancy Balla commented the size allowed for porches/decks was too small. Tim Small made a motion to keep the % of porches/decks at 25%-Jay Fish seconded it. John Berglund made a motion to increase the % from 25% to 30%-was seconded by Eric Eichner. The public in attendance, nor the members of the Planning Board suggested any changes to the proposed definition of Living Area. These proposals to be voted on by town voters by means of a warrant article in March 2012 @ annual Town Meeting.

December: Regular Meeting

Bruce Smith stopped by to find out information on the public hearing from November.

We submitted the proposed changes to Article II B and adding a definition for "living area" to the select-board for town vote in March.

SURRY CONSERVATION COMMISSION March 2012 Annual Report to the Town

This year, Commission has worked on several projects that benefit the town as a whole. We also continue to monitor construction projects around town, including the Joslin Road bridge reconstruction, and to urge land owners to use generally recognized best practices in land conservation to protect water, soil and wildlife in our diverse environment.

Currently, the Commission is evaluating forest management proposals for the Graf Town Forest. The Commission expects to contract with one of the companies to begin work this spring. The management plan will include an inventory of the plants, animals and soils present, so we may promote and protect them. The plan will also advise on a limited timber harvest to allow the young trees to grow better and to yield income to build hiking trails in the forest. The boundaries will be marked; the timber value will be appraised.

On the morning of Old Home Day, the Commission hosted the third annual hike in the Graf Town Forest. The Recreation Commission thoughtfully provided water for the hike. More people than ever came, with several from out-of-town. We welcome people of all ages and abilities to join us next year. It's a pleasant two-and-a half-hour hike to see a wide variety of plant life and interesting forest landscapes including rocky ledges, a stream, a vernal pool, a pond and a meadow.

The Surry School Board and the Surry Conservation Commission worked cooperatively to remove the underground oil storage tank at the school and replace it with two smaller above-ground tanks. The purpose of was to replace failing components as well as to protect the aquifer located under the village. The NH Department of Environmental Services helped us site the new tanks with respect to environmental and practical considerations.

The Commission continues to consider whether to discontinue Class 6 town roads with little or no use. This supports the Surry Master Plan goal to preserve the rural nature of the town. We hope the residents will approve the warrant article to discontinue the part of Wilbur Road east of the Cider Mill subdivision boundary (where the Graf Town Forest starts), across Route 12A. A section of Wilbur Road seems to have been discontinued years ago, but following the current legal processes would make the records clearer.

Additionally, to help retain the rural character of Surry, there are many undeveloped areas in town that could be preserved as they currently are. With a

carefully constructed conservation easement you can sell the development rights to a land stewardship organization (such as the Monadnock Conservancy) while you continue to own, live on and use your land. If you would like to know more about this, please contact the Commission. We can help you contact appropriate organizations and can help fund the legal work.

The Conservation Commission is proud to work with local organizations such as the Ashuelot River Advisory Committee, the Monadnock Conservancy, local Conservation Commissions, the Army Corps of Engineers and Land for the Good.

Meetings for the Conservation Commission are held on the second Monday of the month at 7:00pm, at the Town Hall. If you have an interest in preserving Surry's wild and cultural resources, we welcome you to join us; come for an evening or come for a year.

Surry entered 2011 with snow and more snow. However the Town was able to meet and overcome the near record snowfall. There were two storms later in the year that did not impact Surry as much as they impacted our neighbors. Hurricane Irene caused very little damage in our town. And the Halloween snowstorm also caused minor problems to Surry. The extensive tree trimming by PSNH the past several years on their power lines prevented any large electrical interruptions.

The Town's Emergency Operation Plan has been rewritten and accepted by both the Selectmen and the State. This is one of the required reports that the Town must have to receive future grants.

I have been able to take several on-line training courses through FEMA during the past year. As usual the State has failed to support the town in this area.

The Town now has access to an Emergency Notification System called "nixle". While there are strict limitations on who can activate the system, everyone can get access to the messages. These messages will be in text form; there is no voice messages.

The Surry Village Charter School (SVCS) is a State authorized open enrollment public school. Parents do not pay tuition as long as they are legal residents of New Hampshire. Partial funding is provided by the State of New Hampshire, SVCS raises the balance of its budget through fundraising. The Surry Village Charter School was founded by Surry residents and local educators to provide a local public school option. The charter school model is one method to maintain a viable student population in relatively small towns such as Surry. New Hampshire Curriculum Frameworks and Grade Level Expectations form the basis of the curriculum. As a village school, students are engaged in real world activities that connect them to the local community.

Approximately 90 students attend Surry Village Charter School, K-6 in Surry, 7/8 in Keene.

March 2012 Annual Report of the Surry School District Officers

The Annual Surry School District Business Meeting will be on Thursday, March 22, 2012, 7:00 pm at the Surry Town Hall. The copies of the Warrant Articles and the Budget will be posted and also available on the Surry website.

This year is the fourth year for the Surry children in the Keene Public Schools. From all feedback we receive, the children are happy and doing well. There are sixty-four Surry students attending in Keene (the last MRHS seniors graduated in 2010). So far this year, we have had three new students move to Surry, which balanced the three who moved to other local towns. In addition, nine Surry students are tuitioned privately, eight are home schooled, and twelve attend the Surry Village Charter School. Thank you to all in town who have been so helpful to the Board in keeping an accurate census of Surry's children.

In August 2010, the Surry School District became SAU 91. Surry received contracted services from SAU 38 for the 2010-2011 fiscal year. The School District contracted with SAU 94 (Winchester) for superintendent and business services beginning July 1, 2011. This has been a highly satisfactory arrangement and will continue, hopefully, for the foreseeable future. Joining SAU 29 does not seem to be a possibility for the near term.

The Surry Village Charter School and the Surry School District are in the second year of a three year lease for the Surry School building. The rent for the current year is \$10,000 and \$15,000 in the third year. The lease states that the School Board assumes the costs of repairs of major system failures and the Charter School assumes the costs of maintenance and utilities. The School Board and Charter School have enjoyed a good working relationship this year.

The Surry School District is under contract with the Keene School District to send all its public school students to Keene. The Board's policy follows state law which requires the School District to provide a public education for Surry resident students. The School Board is glad to hold conversations with families ahead of time regarding requests for exception to this policy.

This year, the Board has begun to develop a facilities master plan. Patrick Richardson, of Richardson Home Inspection, generously donated his time and expertise to inspect the school building. He prepared a list of work needed, and helped us to prioritize it. The Board was pleased to find there were no major problems that needed immediate attention. This year the Board will look into the

issues raised by the inspection: the roof over the addition, the septic system and the lack of building insulation.

Beginning in August, the large underground oil storage tank was replaced with two smaller above-ground tanks. These were enclosed in a shed on the front of the school building. The Board worked closely with an environmental engineer, the NH Department of Environmental Services and the contractor to site the new tanks and assure no leakage. The project replaced decaying tank components that had caused issues with heating system. It also will protect the town drinking water in the aquifer located under the village. As part of the project, the gravel driveway was filled and leveled. The Charter School staff and students were most accommodating of the work that continued into the school year.

Surry residents, the Board sincerely appreciates the support you have shown us. We welcome your input at our meetings. We meet the third Monday of the month at 7:00 at the Surry School building. Phone or email contact information is posted on front door of the school and on the school bulletin board at the Town Hall.
