SELECTMEN

MEETING MINUTES MAY 1, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. Present were Jay Croteau, Bruce Smith and Eric Eichner.

Richard Davis spoke with the selectmen about a building permit for a cold storage building. The selectmen denied the permit due to inadequate frontage and insufficient acreage for the zoning. The selectmen have referred him to the zoning board for a variance application.

The trash on the Old Walpole Road has been reported to the state police.

The selectmen signed the Intent to excavate for Tobey Barrett.

The selectmen signed and paid bills.

The selectmen signed payroll.

The selectmen signed the EFTPS payment.

The selectmen signed the payroll liabilities.

The Conservation Committee approved the Lippincott driveway permit and it has moved to the Planning Board.

Robert Bergevin spoke with the selectmen about the work he would like to have done on the North cemetery. He received reimbursement for the purchase of flags and flag holders for patriotic purposes. He will speak to the trustees of trust funds next week regarding the use of the cemetery trusts.

The yield tax for the Hall property was given to John Davis.

Jay Croteau motioned to accept the minutes. Eric Eichner seconded the motion. The selectmen agreed to accept the minutes as presented.

The Town of Surry received proposal of \$20,132.22 for a 20 inch culvert sleeve from EJ Prescott for the lower Pond Rd culvert which includes the removal of the barrel and the concrete. The operation may need an additional wetland permit for minimal impact. Bruce Smith will contact Jonathan Sissson for the consultation about the additional permitting.

Leah Garrapy asked the selectmen if her daughter could put up a library book box out by the road. The selectmen agreed that it would be permissible. She also talked about the guidelines for cottage industries in her zoning. She would like to establish a health coaching business with clients visiting her home three to four times a week and her husband would like to establish an online gun sales and gun repair business onsite. The selectmen agreed according to the zoning they could have both types of

businesses. The gun business would also require federal approval . The selectmen also went over the signage limits with her.

Jay Croteau motioned to adjourn. Eric Eichner seconded the motion. The selectmen agreed to adjourn.
