SELECTMEN

MEETING MINUTES JULY 8 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. Present were Jay Croteau, Eric Eichner and Jamison Hines.

The selectmen signed and mailed the abatement for Eversource settlement. Jay Croteau notified Gary Kinyon and Gary Roberge of Avitar regarding the settlement.

The selectmen reviewed the PA 29 and the welfare guidelines for a resident requesting assistance.

The selectmen signed the payroll.

The selectmen signed the State of New Hampshire DMV deposit for 7/8/2018.

Jay Croteau worked on a Pistol permit for a resident.

Jamison Hines rode with Durwin Clark to learn more about his work schedule. The retaining pond on Cider Mill site needs to be trimmed and mowed. Durwin Clark will add it to the mowing schedule when the roadsides are done.

Jamison Hines also inspected the Figa driveway. Durwin Clark will work on Wednesday to take down the buildup and improve the drainage.

Jamison Hines spoke with Tim Bievenu about taking down the trees in question on the Joslin Rd. Sandy Gourley has stated she would like to have them remain. He also spoke with him about the trees in question on the Farm Road and felt the best option would be for him to fell the trees with the aid of Dave Brooks and his excavator. Durwin Clark will contact Phil's to get a price on the same work.

The Conservation Committee is looking at the Wright's Grove site across from Leslie Carlson's.

The selectmen reviewed the Highway department half year budget report. The amount spent to date is \$96,000.00 at the halfway mark without the purchase of salt for November and December. The quote for the garage door has been set aside for 2020 budgeting. There still is no quote from Jackson for the installation of the heating system.

The selectmen will send the invoices from Mitchel for the paving on the Pond Road and the one from Fairfield for the plow equipment to the Trustees of Trust funds for reimbursement.

Jay Croteau motioned to accept the minutes. Eric Eichner seconded the motion. The selectmen agreed to accept the minutes.

The selectmen read the 2018 Cyclical Monitoring Inspection Report from the DRA. The report was sent to Avitar for review on March 8, 2019. Some small errors were found and reported to Avitar and will be corrected.

Jay Croteau had a complaint from a resident about people living in campers on Bear Den with questionable activity happening. John Davis reported the wetlands dispute at Bear Den was still on hold. John Davis also reported he has not received a timber report from Wayne Young yet.

Mr. Davis also reported there would be a memorial tree planted in Wright Grove on Old Home Day. He commented he had forester Steve Roberge visit the site for management recommendations.

Eric Eichner motioned to adjourn. Jay Croteau seconded the motion. The selectmen motioned to adjourn.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 P.M.
