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#### SELECTMEN'S MESSAGE

- 1. The appearance of our historic Town Hall was greatly improved last year in time for Old Home Day when local contractor Zach Payne completed the belltower clapboard replacement project. A new heating system is our project for this year.
- 2. Thanks to a very cooperative Eversource employee, most streetlights in town have been replaced at no cost with much more efficient and less costly LED lights in what seems to have been a seamless transition.
- 3. The southern end of the Old Walpole Road was repaved last year after grinding the old pavement to better serve as a base. The project will continue this year with another section being prepared and paved if money is approved in the operating budget.
- 4. The final action items of a 2015 culvert survey prepared by the Southwest Regional Planning Commission were completed last year with the replacement of four culverts and outlet dredging of another by Mike Edwards of MME. Corrugated steel culverts that corrode have been replaced, and increased in size, by corrugated plastic culverts that do not corrode.
- 5. Design approval has been received for a septic system at the Highway Garage. Construction approval could be troublesome at the former dump site.
- 6. Out of 234 municipalities in the state, only two set their tax rates before us, a sign that things are going well administratively in Surry.
- 7. Our tax rate dropped from \$16.06 to \$16.02 in 2023 because a slight drop in enrollment allowed the School District to pay less than estimated in tuition.
- 8. As recommended by our contract assessor and state assessing monitor, the warrant includes article 6 to limit the solar exemption adopted in 1977 from total system assessed value to \$1000 per system. The change would be much simpler to administer and would help protect our tax base for the future. Protecting our tax base is very important because education is funded by the property tax in NH, and we formed our own school district. Since then, enrollment has risen from 58 to a high of 129, and our ability to pay as calculated by the State has dropped from where, out of 234 municipalities, in 2008 there were 189 poorer than us to where there are now 16 poorer than us. We also try to avoid giving tax breaks to one group of citizens at the expense of another group. For these reasons we strongly encourage you to approve article 6 as written.
- 9. Thanks to our staff and equipment, drainage improvements have been made to the Dort Road and the western portion of the Joslin Road, allowing us to get more for our money. Article 13 asks permission to continue the Joslin Road project.

- 10. Article 14 asks for \$10,000 to be spent to update the Town's 1983 master plan, a large portion of which was updated in 2001. RSA 674:3 recommends an update every 5 to 10 years. Volunteer willingness to participate by sharing your view of what Surry should be like in the future is as essential as the appropriation. If you are willing to serve on the steering committee for this project, please email selectmen@surry.nh.gov with your contact information.
- 11. This year's warrant includes article 15 to get a sense of the meeting on joining Cheshire County's Community Power Plan. The County has made it very easy for towns to join, with the main requirement being someone in town willing to represent us on the county operating board. The article is on the warrant to see if there is interest.
- 12. Much time and effort was spent in 2023 appealing a decision from FEMA concerning the closed, eastern portion of the Pond Road, with much very convincing evidence presented. In the end, it didn't matter, as FEMA's only concern is whether or not the road is open. We continue to believe it is important to reopen the road and so have asked for approval in article 16 to try to do that.
- 13. Occasionally we are asked about broadband internet service. One provider has serviced a corner of town, on 12A north to Pond Road and part way up Pond Road, for a couple of years but its service area has not grown. A statewide service map shows the entire town as having broadband access which we know is inaccurate. We authorized a group from UNH, when we were asked, to use our addresses in updating that service map. We are doing what we can, but our rural character limits our options.
- 14. Thank you for sharing our interest in the well-being of the Town of Surry, and we urge you to take the next step by attending public hearings, volunteering to serve on a committee, hold an office, or help count ballots on election day.





## WARRANT

#### Article 01 Election of Officers

To choose all necessary Town officers as listed on the official ballot.

#### Article 02 Zoning Amendment

To see if the Town will vote to amend Article III, General Provisions, Subsection C of the Zoning Ordinance by adding the last line in quotes, to read as follows:

C. No recreational vehicle, as defined by this ordinance, shall be used or occupied as a permanent dwelling within the Town of Surry. The use of a recreational vehicle as a temporary dwelling (outside of a legally existing recreational vehicle park) for recreational or vacation purposes shall not exceed thirty (30) days in any calendar year provided that the Board of Selectmen is satisfied that a safe and sanitary method of sewage, wastewater and solid waste disposal will be provided. "Upon request, the selectmen may extend the use of a properly installed recreational vehicle as a temporary dwelling up to 24 months, when the primary dwelling has been made uninhabitable and is being repaired or reconstructed."

This amendment allows the selectmen to extend the use of a recreational vehicle as a dwelling in an emergency when the primary dwelling is not habitable.

#### Article 03 Zoning Amendment

To see if the Town will vote to amend Article X, Board of Adjustment, Subsection E, Variance, of the Zoning Ordinance by adding the following section 6:

The applicant shall pay all relevant costs in connection with any related public hearing.

This amendment clarifies that the payment of costs for public hearings is required for the consideration of a variance.

#### Article 04 Hear Reports

To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees.

#### Article 05 Operating Budget

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the Budget Committee recommended sum of \$692,972 for general municipal operations. This article does not include appropriations contained in special or individual articles addressed separately. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 06 Amend Solar Exemption

To see if the Town will vote to amend article 6, adopted March 8, 1977, by replacing the exemption that "shall be in an amount of 100% of the property tax on the assessed value of a solar energy heating or cooling system" with an exemption of \$1,000 in assessed value per tax year, per RSA 72:27-a III and RSA 72:62, effective March 15, 2024. The Selectmen recommend this article. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 07 Fund Hwy Equip CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to place into the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund established in 1992 for the future purchase of highway equipment. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 08 Fund Fire Truck CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000 to place into the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund established in 2011 for the future purchase of a fire truck. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 09 Fund Revaluation CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 to place into the Property Revaluation Capital Reserve fund established in 2001 for a future property revaluation. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 10 Fund Cemetery CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to place into the Future Cemetery Capital Reserve fund established in 2023 for future cemetery space. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 11 Fund Fire Equip CRF

To see if the Tewn will vete to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to place into the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund established in 2018 for the future purchase of fire equipment. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 12 Fund Bridge CRF

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,817 to be placed into the Bridge Capital Reserve fund established in 2023 per RSA 35:1, with said funds to come from unreserved fund balance. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 13 Joslin Road drainage

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,327 for upper Joslin Road drainage improvements with said funds to come from unassigned fund balance (this represents the funds received in 2022 from the American Rescue Plan Act). The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 14 Master Plan

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to update portions of the 1983 Master Plan per RSA 674:3 II. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 15 Community Power

To hear opinions of an advisory nature on the amount of interest in participating in Cheshire

#### Community Power.

#### Article 16 Reclassify Pond Rd East

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$187,795 to reopen and reclassify from class 6 to class 5, per RSA 231:22-a, the eastern section of Pond Road between Route 12A and Village Road, with \$87,795 to come from the Road Improvement Capital Reserve Fund established in 2015 and \$100,000 from unassigned fund balance. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

#### Article 17 Other Business

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## Report of the Trustees of the Trust Funds for 2023

To the residents of the Town of Surry:

The trust funds are managed by New Hampshire Public Deposit Investment Pool (NHPDIP) and Bar Harbor Wealth Management. The Trustees continually review the funds and are pleased with the performance of these investment managers. Considerably higher interest rates in 2023 provided increased earnings on the NHPDIP funds again this year, even though these funds are very conservatively invested. The school funds invested with Bar Harbor continue to show growth.

The Trustees work with the Cemetery Trustees on both general maintenance and perpetual care reimbursements to the Town. For 2023, the Town was reimbursed \$428.79 for general maintenance care of the trust fund lots.


# March 2024 Annual Report Surry School District Officers SAU 91

The Annual Surry School District Business Meeting will be on Thursday, March 14, 2024, 7:00 pm at the Surry Town Hall. The Warrant Articles and the Budget are posted, and available here and on the Surry website.

This year is the sixteenth year of the Surry School District. As of January 2<sup>nd</sup>, there are ninety Surry students attending in Keene. Eighteen Surry students are tuitioned privately, seven are home schooled, and sixteen attend area charter schools. These non-Keene students have saved Surry \$541,403 this year.

There are five reasons why the tuition costs vary from year to year.

- How many students do we have? Eighteen graduating seniors will be replaced by eight kindergartners next fall. Surry, like all of New England has declining birth rate.
- How many children move in or move out of town? This year, there were two more students who changed their enrollment to Keene than those who moved out or went elsewhere.
- How many children receive special education services? This year, there are six more students who switched to Keene (at a higher tuition rate) to receive their special needs programming.
- Where do Surry students attend school? Families have more public charter school and more homeschooling options. Families are choosing private schools from Dublin to Putney. Statewide, about 80% of children attend public schools, in Surry it is 82%.
- What are Keene's tuition rates? For 2024-25, the high school regular and special education tuitions will be lower, but they will be higher for middle school and elementary school than this year's rates.



The educational needs of Surry students are primary focus of the Board. Keene principals report that Surry students have assimilated without issue and are doing well. The number of school-age and preschool-age students who need special services is increasing each year. We supply special education services to students at the charter schools and two preschools to help children enter kindergarten level with their peers.

Surry School District is administered by Superintendent Kim Caron, Special Education Coordinator Julie Frenrich and Business Manager Nathan Castle. The new administration is providing excellent service to the Board. The annual financial audit done by CPAs at Vashon Clukay found our accounts to be in order.

The Surry School District is under contract with the Keene School District to send all its public-school students to Keene. State law requires the School District to provide a public education for Surry resident students. Families planning changes in their children's education are encouraged to contact the School Board ahead of time using the town website <a href="www.surry.nh.gov">www.surry.nh.gov</a>. This way the School Board can determine whether tuition due will be the responsibility of the School District or the family.

Inspection of the Surry School building a few years ago found that the physical structure is in good shape. Although the building passed its annual fire inspection and health and safety inspection, building components are wearing out. We are replacing room heaters with energy-efficient heaters that will circulate fresh air, necessary for a healthy environment. The School Board assumes the costs of major system failures and the Surry Village Charter School assumes the costs of maintenance and utilities, as it is housed in the Surry School building rent-free.

For the safety of the children, and to protect the integrity of the school driveway, the School Board reminds residents that the school driveway is not a public road. Signs have been posted at both ends of the driveway specifying that the driveway is for school access only.

Surry residents, the Board sincerely appreciates the support you have shown us, especially in keeping the school census accurate. We welcome your input at our meetings. We meet the third Monday of the month at 7:00 at the Surry School building.

## **Surry Planning Board Year in Review 2023**

**January:** A public hearing was held to consider amendments to the Surry Zoning Ordinance. The board voted to place an amendment clarifying the definitions of mobile homes, manufactured housing and pre-site built housing on the warrant for Town Meeting.

February: Final copies of the Brooks subdivision were received and signed.

**March:** Bruce Smith provided research into the authority of the Town to enforce driveway construction and suggests a reference to RSA 236:13 be added to the driveway application.

**April:** Jay Croteau, chairman of the Zoning Board of Adjustment, appeared with information about a reapplication for an expired variance which allowed a building on a substandard lot owned by Richard Davis located on Route 12. Site Plan Review would be required and a joint public hearing was proposed. Bruce Smith shared information about the required posting of fees for various applications. He also pointed out that Surry has two telecommunication towers which require updated information.

May: Matt Goodwin was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Planning Board.

**June:** A driveway application for Anne Pratt on Lot 13 Cider Mill Drive was reviewed. Courtney Davis, representing Richard Davis, appeared for discussion about the need for a variance prior to a building permit on Richard Davis's substandard lot on Route 12. Steve Goldsmith appeared and suggested that the Zoning Ordinance be amended to allow use of a recreational vehicle as a dwelling for longer than 30 days in certain emergencies.

**July:** A joint public hearing with the Zoning Board of Adjustment to consider a variance and site plan review for a proposed storage and equipment maintenance building on property of Richard Davis located on Route 12 was held. After the variance was approved by the Board of Adjustment, the Planning Board reviewed the site plan and approved same.

**August:** Matt Goodwin reported on South West Region Planning Commission's Complete Streets Program and suggested that we look at other programs offered by that organization.

**September:** Jacob Bramel appeared for a preliminary consultation regarding the subdivision of a 90 acre parcel on the Joslin Road. He is considering either a 14-lot subdivision or a 25-lot cluster development. Current zoning does not allow a cluster development. Discussion followed regarding the lack of school bus and mail service, the status of parts of the Joslin Road and the need for a cistern(s) for fire protection at that location.

**October:** Proposed letters to two telecommunication companies with towers in Surry were discussed. Bruce Smith would like some clarification language regarding fees for public hearings added to the Zoning Ordinance. Various statistics regarding population, building permits and student population were discussed as well as the options for charging developers for off-site improvements required by development as described in RSA 674:21 V (j).

**November:** Proposed zoning amendments for the 2024 Town Meeting were discussed.

**December:** The board voted to request a \$1500 budget for 2024. Matt Goodwin and Bruce Smith led a discussion about the Town's Master Plan which is more than 20 years old. It is a project that is too large for the Planning Board to do on its own. We will consult with South West Region Planning Commission about services and costs and place an article on the Town Warrant to see if there is enough interest in Surry to proceed with that project. John Davis from the Conservation Commission appeared to discuss the enforcement of driveway permits.

# Surry Conservation Commission March 2024 Annual Report to the Town

The Conservation Commission, working with the NH Department of Environmental Services, the Cheshire County Conservation District, the Army Corps of Engineers, and the Monadnock Conservancy, is committed to preserving and protecting the natural environment, the flora and the fauna in Surry. One of our members serves on the Ashuelot River Local Advisory Committee which is developing a river management plan. Commission members commented on the Army Corps proposed ten-year plan for the federal land in the Ashuelot River area.

The commission appreciates the outstanding support received from town residents for the village cornfield easement project which carried out Clarence and Grace Bergeron's vision for the land.

We worked closely with the town attorney, the landowners and the farmer for six months to write the document designed to enhance the rural nature of Surry village. In July, Surry purchased the development rights, using most of the Conservation Fund. The landowners can sell the land if they want to, but future buyers would have to keep it in agriculture forever and follow the other guidelines in the document. Conservation members installed a kiosk built and donated by Bill Bigelow containing a sign designed and donated by Inkberry.

The Commission has been working with the owners of a large tract in Walpole and Surry, and with landowners of two other properties in Surry, about placing their land in a conservation easement. This would keep these forested properties in their natural state to protect water and soil quality, and to promote wildlife. Additions to the Conservation Fund will be needed to support these projects. These properties would be in addition to Wright's Grove, Graf Town Forest, and Surry Mountain land the Conservation Commission is currently managing. The Commission hired a forestry consultant to establish and blaze the Surry Mountain boundaries. The Registry of Deeds lacks documentation of the boundaries, so a survey will be needed before the management plan can be developed.

Cheshire County, the Monadnock Regional Rail Trail Coalition and the Keene Sno-Riders Snowmobile Club recently completed work to repair and upgrade the Surry portion of the Cheshire Rail Trail, with a grant from the Putnam Foundation and donation by Phil's Tree Service. The project was managed by the Keene Sno-Riders with who coordinated the work and provided volunteers to clear debris, brush, trees and boulders from the eroded railroad cut. The next phase of this project is to begin resurfacing. One of our members was involved in this project designed to promote hiking, biking and wildlife.

The Surry Commission is a member of the NH Association of Conservation Commissions. One of our members serves on this board.

The Association has advised that state law provides a clear role for local conservation commissions to participate in environmental planning, monitoring and law enforcement. One of these functions is to review driveway permits, to avoid future problems for both the landowner and the town. Another role is to prepare a Natural Resource Inventory to aid the town in establishing priorities for preservation. The commission is informally monitoring development on Farm Road and advising the owner about avoiding wetlands violations.

If you have any questions about what you can do to preserve your land, soil, water or wildlife resources, the Conservation Commission will be glad to help. If you have a concern about a possible environmental infraction, or want guidance in how to avoid one, please come to one of our meetings. We meet the first Monday of the month (except holidays), 7:00 PM, at the Surry Town Hall. All are welcome.

#### February 15th 2024

Last year set a record high of 123 calls for service. This was after last year's record of 102, which is a 20% increase. Among the incidents this year were 2 structure fires in Surry. Our volunteers along with our mutual aid partners were able to minimize the structural damage and save both houses. Sadly, the fire on Webster Road did result in Surry's first fatality by fire in nearly 50 years.

The Fire Department continues to make great strides to improve upon our emergency preparedness for the residents of Surry. Continuing the momentum from the past several years, we have expanded our capabilities even further. We have updated various outdated equipment and have new specialized rescue tools coming soon. Through countless hours spent behind the scenes by the volunteers, most of this has been acquired through alternative funding sources saving Surry taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars. Surry remains unique in that we are still 100% volunteer. It is the 23 familiar faces of your neighbors offering comfort while answering and mitigating all calls for service. Fire prevention and outreach for the year included inspections, visits to Surry Village Charter School, Freedom Reins, and a Library-sponsored Touch-a-truck event.

#### Emergency Medical Services

A little over half of the emergencies we respond to are medical in nature. Surry Fire Department operates as a non-transporting first response agency

up to the Advanced EMT level. The cardiac monitor acquired in 2022 under the GOFERR grant program is used during patient assessment at nearly all of these calls. Training, especially high-performance CPR conducted together with our ambulance provider, Keene Fire Department (KFD), leads to seamless responses and transfers to the appropriate hospital. With the changes in the regional ambulance providers our primary ambulances continue to come from KFD and replacing Diluzio our backup ambulances seamlessly come from Cheshire County, Alstead, and Walpole.

Our trained EMRs, EMTs, and AEMTs have responded tirelessly over the course of the COVID-19 pandemic. Protocols have changed over the past few years dealing with this infectious disease as new information about it arrived, and the public health emergency in NH was closed in May 2023 allowing us to return to more routine responses.

#### Grants

We received another successful award of substantial funding through FEMA's Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG). This annual grant is highly competitive with only 23% of requests being granted. We are fortunate to be one of the chosen and were awarded \$52,462 for a vehicle extrication package. This includes hydraulic rescue tools most commonly known as the "Jaws of Life," stabilization struts for rollover crashes, and airbags for lifting of heavy objects like vehicles. These tools are critical in motor vehicle accidents when people are trapped. Currently we rely on our mutual aid partners for their equipment but the availability of this assistance is not a guarantee. With the




added storage in Engine 1, we now have the capacity to carry this equipment and be more self-sufficient. The overall availability of emergency responders in the region is on the decline. Ensuring we have the equipment needed in-house without relying on other departments is critical to providing the best service possible for those in dire need of care. We are currently in the demonstration stage of various brands and will obtain this equipment in

the next few months.

The second item applied for last year but was not awarded was the replacement of Engine 3, our 1978 Mini-Pumper currently used as our brush truck. While this vehicle has served the town extremely well over its 45-year lifespan, its questionable reliability and outdated design is bringing it to the end of its effective service life. We will apply for this grant again this year in hopes not to place this large financial burden onto the Surry taxpayers. Whether the grant is awarded or not, we are looking at replacing this truck with something more suitable for our current needs.

A new request added in this year's AFG application is for two-way radios. The radios and



batteries providing crucial communication have also reached the end of their operational life. They were acquired through a state grant post-9/11 in 2001 and we are no longer able to purchase repair parts or replacement batteries safe enough to be used in hazardous environments. After discussions with other surrounding towns with the same need we have been unable to find a town willing to host a regional application. Applying as a region improves the chances to receive the award for all but instead this year we will be competing with other small rural communities in hopes to acquire reliable communication radios through the grant.

#### Fire Station Expansion Update

The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) grant was fully executed last year and is now closed. As the members have ability, we continue to pick away at punch list items remaining from the renovation. The improvement in working conditions and efficiency of the station cannot be overstated. In an effort to stretch the budget, most improvements around the station have been completed in-house by the volunteers with trade skills. We are proud of our facility and continue to be grateful for the generosity of those in the community who made it possible. Pictured to the right

thanks to the space added by the renovation. In 2023 we placed new life safety equipment into service including replacement of all of our Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA), addition of a Breathing Air Compressor/Fill Station, and (3) thermal imaging cameras with search function.

## Report of the State Police



Town of Surry 2023

I would like to take this opportunity to provide a report to the Surry Selectboard regarding the calls for service that the State Police have responded to in your community during the last year. In years past, we have provided a convenient snapshot of police activity. Moving forward, it is my intention to provide the town's government and citizens a clearer picture of the types of calls the State Police have responded to, and the police services we are providing, including proactive enforcement. The information provided below does not include logged calls to our dispatch center where it was determined a Trooper did not need to respond.

Currently, the Troopers assigned to Troop C respond to calls in Surry as requested and as part of our regular patrol duties. Troop C provides police services to the 38 towns encompassing Cheshire and Sullivan Counties; and are the primary law enforcement agency for 18 of these towns. Additionally, Troopers are frequently called upon to provided patrol coverage, investigative or other specialized law enforcement services to police departments within this area.

# Ashuelot River Local Advisory Committee

2023 Annual Report

ARLAC members met monthly to discuss permits, projects and concerns along the River corridor, and involved the community with our water quality monitoring program and river cleanup. The Ashuelot River Corridor Management Plan revisions are nearing completion.

**PERMITS:** ARLAC members carefully reviewed plans for Shoreland, Wetland and Alteration of Terrain applications. We made comments to the appropriate state agencies or followed the progress of projects through the permitting process.

- Culvert replacements in Gilsum (3 sites) and Winchester (1 site).
- Eversource pole replacements on the 381 and A152 lines. Vote to approve.
- Washington, Ashuelot Pond: 2 Shoreland permits (warn of steep bank; follow noncompliance violation); PBN to rebuild the boat ramp (approve).
- Keene: 1 wetland violation (Bretwood Golf Course); 1 Wetland permit (Island St. bridge);
   AOT and Shoreland permits to demolish KSC residence hall; City sewage pump failure at
   Martel Court pump station, review Emergency Authorization Verification.
- Marlow Hydro: Follow the re-application process as submitted to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. Comments forthcoming.
- Swanzey: River Access Park, follow Shoreland and Wetland permits and review work.
- Gilsum: AOT blasting and re-use of sand and gravel pit (G2 Holdings). Letter of concern regarding need for monitoring wells, control of nitrates/nitrites, tree cutting steep slopes and resultant sedimentation of wetlands, noise pollution.
- Winchester: AOT amendment by Lawrence Realty LLC, letter of concern regarding location of monitoring wells to check for groundwater contamination.
- Winchester: Drinking Water and Groundwater Trust Fund, Environmental review of replacement storage tanks and booster pump station at Town facility. Letter of support.
- Gilsum: Shoreland. Blacksmith shop. Approve but recommend erosion controls.

#### PROJECTS OR ISSUES

- Winchester: Lost Road: Seepage on road and onto river bank likely buried rusty metal, continue to follow.
- Tree cutting within Shoreland setback buffers in Gilsum, Marlow, and Winchester.
- Mature fallen trees in river after high water events (Gilsum, Swanzey).
- · Shoreland erosion, two sites in Swanzey. Working with partners to remedy.
- Follow progress: Fiske Dam removal (Hinsdale); Airport fencing (Swanzey); NHDOT flood storage mitigation (Keene); Ashuelot River Park canoe/kayak access (Keene); Instream Flow project (NHDES).
- Army Corps of Engineers Management Plans for Otter and Surry Lake Dams, review.
- West Swanzey: Urban Exemption from Shoreland protection impacting buffers.
- Swanzey: possible sale of Town conservation land. Site visit and comments to Conservation Commission in favor of retaining ownership.
- Rivers Management Advisory Committee road salt seminar attended by two members.
- Keene Heritage Trail development: No comment, not in corridor.
- Corridor Management Plan: ARLAC worked with the Southwest Regional Planning Commission and NHDES to develop and finalize the plan. Revisions almost completed.

#### COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

 September 29-30: Source to the Sea cleanup of the Ashuelot River and Beaver Brook in Keene, Swanzey, and Winchester. 2,712 pounds of trash gathered from waters and shorelines.

Monthly May-September: River Water Quality Monitoring by 19 volunteers, funded by corridor town Conservation Commissions and NHDES. The Ashuelot River maintained State standards at its Class B designation for dissolved oxygen, total phosphorus, chloride, turbidity and specific conductance; pH remained below (more acidic) the required standard at sites located upstream of Surry Dam, and began to approach the standard in Keene and downstream. A storm event in August produced higher levels of E.coli, total phosphorus, chloride and specific conductance; once again reflecting the impact of stormwater run-off. - (40) body feet or more in length, or when erected on site, is three hundred twenty (320) square feet or more, and which is built on permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling with or without a permanent foundation when connected to required utilities, which include plumbing, heating and electrical heating systems contained therein. Manufactured housing as defined in this section shall not include presite built housing as defined in RSA 674:31-a. See RSA 674:31.
- R. Presite Built Housing means any structure designed primarily for residential occupancy which is wholly or in substantial part made, fabricated, formed or assembled in off-site manufacturing facilities in conformance with United States Department of Housing and Urban Development minimum property standards and local building codes, for installation, or assembly and installation, on the building site. Presite built housing shall not include manufactured housing. See RSA 674:31-a.

This amendment will clarify the definitions of manufactured housing and mobile homes and add a definition of presite built homes, often called modular homes, by using the statutory definitions.
