

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## TRIBUTE

"It is not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbles, or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, who comes up short again and again, ... who spends himself in a worthy cause; who at the best knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly." Excerpted from *Citizenship In A Republic*, a speech by Theodore Roosevelt delivered at the Sorbonne in Paris, France, on April 23, 1910.

Self-government depends upon the willingness of citizens to *serve*, in the arena, as Roosevelt so eloquently stated. We honor a past long serving citizen who departed us in 2025.

Virginia Clark died in September. She was a native of Winchester who with husband Hugh first became a Surry property owner on June 19, 1950. Most know her as the Town Treasurer from 1966 to 2016, a ballot inspector for 40+ years and for helping Hugh mow cemeteries from 1969 to 2012. For perspective, Johnson, Nixon, Ford, Carter, Reagan, Bush, Clinton, Bush and Obama served as president while she was Surry's treasurer, and all her records were written in a ledger, not keyed into a computer. And, try to imagine the sheer number of ballots she handed to voters in how many elections during those 40+ years of service to Surry residents. Appropriately, she and Hugh were named Surry Citizens of the Year in 1994.

In addition to her town duties, she was wife to husband Hugh, mother to sons Gerald and Durwin, mother-in-law to Darlene, instrumental in raising grandchildren Matthew and Stacey, played a role in raising great grandchildren too numerous to mention, and early in her marriage, her grandmother lived with the family in her last years.

Virginia died two months shy of her 96<sup>th</sup> birthday, ending her role at the center of hundreds of years of Clark family service to Surry, and leaving a void in both town and family.

## Message from the Selectmen

If you attended a Select Board meeting this past year, you may have noticed that we moved our public meetings into the main room at Town Hall. This change allows for a more traditional meeting format and provides additional space for residents to attend and participate. While attendance varied, there were several evenings when citizens came to listen, hear what we were working on, and offer comments. It was good to see and hear from those who attended, and this meeting format will continue going forward.

To make better use of meeting time, the Board also began using a formal agenda. If you wish to bring an item before the Board, we encourage you to request placement on the agenda in advance. Email works best for this at [selectmen@surry.nh.gov](mailto:selectmen@surry.nh.gov). Each meeting also includes a short period for unscheduled public input, questions, and requests when matters are time sensitive.

When you visit Town Hall, you may notice several improvements. A new “Surry Town Hall” sign now hangs out front, the porch has been repainted, and the first-floor interior has also received fresh paint. In the coming year, we plan to continue work on the porch, including new lattice, crushed stone across the front, the addition of rain gutters above the steps, and repairs to the handicap ramp railings. We also plan to repave the parking area.

On this year’s warrant, you will see an article requesting \$10,000 to be added to the Building Maintenance Fund for future maintenance needs. We are saving for the eventual replacement of the Town Hall roof. While the existing roof is holding up well, we want to be prepared when the time comes. The Town Hall is an important community building, and we take pride in maintaining it.

Road work continued this past year with additional paving on Old Walpole Road. In the coming year, we plan to complete the remaining northern section to the Walpole town line. Also budgeted, if approved, is paving the apron where the lower portion of Pond Road meets Route 12A. With these projects completed, the Town’s paved roads will be in good condition. Maintenance is never finished, however, and we will continue monitoring road conditions to determine priorities for 2027.

Improvements are also planned for Farm Road this year. A section at the north end will be rebuilt using fabric and gravel to help reduce spring mud and summer potholes. While gravel roads will always require maintenance, this work should make the road easier to maintain. A new town loader was purchased last year to replace an older model and, with continued maintenance, will help keep gravel roads in better condition. The Town Garage also received a new hot water tank, providing the building with its first source of hot water and completing a multi-year improvement plan.

You may have noticed a new radar speed sign placed in various locations around town. This sign is used to help slow traffic in problem areas and to collect data that assists the Town in

making informed decisions about speed limits and traffic flow. Data shows these signs are effective in many instances, and we will continue to use this tool to improve traffic safety.

Over the past year, the Select Board has worked diligently to improve the Town's permitting and application processes, most notably building and driveway permits. To comply with state building codes and required procedures, you will see a warrant article seeking your support for these efforts. This includes a new building permit fee schedule.

Our intent is to ensure that permit fees are sufficient to cover the cost of retaining a Building Inspector for Surry. Increased compliance requirements lead to more inspections and a greater workload. Under the proposed structure, permit fees paid by applicants are intended to cover inspection costs, payroll taxes, and administrative expenses, resulting in little to no net cost to the Town.

If you do not currently subscribe to the Surry newsletter, we encourage you to do so. The newsletter has developed a strong following and provides timely information about town activities. You can sign up on the Town's homepage at [www.surry.nh.gov](http://www.surry.nh.gov). Newsletters are typically published once or twice a month.

We would also like to thank the Planning Board for its work throughout the year, particularly its efforts on the Surry Zoning Ordinance. There will be several zoning-related questions on the ballot this year proposing amendments to the ordinance. Many of these changes are necessary to comply with recent state-level requirements. We encourage residents to review these proposals in advance, so they are familiar with them before voting. A sample ballot will be posted on the Town website prior to the election.

Finally, we would like to thank all Town officers, administrators, employees, and volunteers who helped keep Surry moving forward this year. Your work is appreciated.

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**Article 01 Election**

To choose all necessary Town officers and act on all other matters as listed on the official ballot.

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**Article 02 Steep Slopes**

Are you in favor of amending the Surry Steep Slopes Ordinance B. Definitions to change the definition of a steep slope to a slope of 15 percent or greater; to change the definition of the Steep Slope District to areas which have a slope of 15 percent or more; and to change D. Regulations 1. To read: "Any of the following that is located on a slope of 15 percent or greater"?

This amendment changes any reference to steep slopes being 20 percent or greater to 15 percent or greater.

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**Article 03 Zoning**

Are you in favor of amending Article VII F. 5. of the Surry Zoning Ordinance to read: "The ADU shall be provided a minimum of 1 off-street parking space"?

This amendment reduces the required parking from two spaces to one space as required by NH RSA 674:16, VII.

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**Article 04 Zoning**

Are you in favor of amending the Surry Zoning Ordinance Article V Table of Use Regulations, A. Residential Use 3. Multi-Unit Dwelling, to permit Multi-Unit Dwellings in the Commercial/Industrial Zone?

This amendment allows a previously not permitted use in the Commercial/Industrial Zone in order to comply with NH RSA 674:80, I.

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**Article 05    Zoning**

Are you in favor of amending the Surry Zoning Ordinance Article XV, Codes, A, by adopting the New Hampshire State Building Code in full, as required by NH RSA 155-A, including all model codes incorporated by reference and as amended by the State Building Code Review Board?

The current code referred to in Article XV, A lists only one part of the State Building Code. NHRSA 155-A:2 states that all buildings, components and structures constructed in New Hampshire shall comply with the state building code and state fire code. NH RSA 155-A, IV lists the International Codes that are incorporated into the state building code by reference.

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**Article 06    Zoning**

Are you in favor of amending Surry Zoning Ordinance Article XV, Codes, B by adopting the New Hampshire State Fire Code as defined in NH RSA 153:1, VI-a including NFPA 1(Fire Code) and NFPA 101 (Life Safety Code) as amended by the State Fire Marshal?

The current Article XV, B refers to the Life Safety code only and applies only to public, commercial and multi-family dwellings. NH RSA 155-A:2 states that all buildings, components and structures shall comply with the state building code and state fire code.

---

**Article 07    Zoning**

Are you in favor of amending the Surry Zoning Ordinance Article IX, Administration, Enforcement and Penalty, D, to read: "The building inspector shall have the authority to accept and review building design documents, issue any and all building permits, perform inspections as may be necessary to assure compliance with the state building code and issue any certificates of occupancy. The Board of Selectmen shall establish a schedule of reasonable fees for building permits, inspections and certificates of occupancy. The Board of Adjustment shall serve as the building code board of appeals to which decisions of the building inspector can be appealed. A building permit shall become void if work has not

commenced within one year. The permit may be renewed or reissued by the building inspector if construction is expected to continue and the project remains in compliance with this ordinance and the state building code. No building permit shall remain valid for more than 3 years from date of issue unless renewed"?

The current Article IX D. does not give the building inspector the authority to issue building permits which are currently issued by the Selectmen. The reference to fees and length of validity for permits are currently in Article IX, B. This amendment brings the ordinance into compliance with NH RSA 155-A:3 and provides for construction delays up to 3 years.

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**Article 08     Zoning**

Are you in favor of amending the Surry Zoning Ordinance Article IX, Administration, Enforcement and Penalty, B. to read: "The Board of Selectmen shall issue any and all sign permits requested when such is in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance. The Board of Selectmen may make a reasonable charge for such permits. All such permits shall be valid for a period of not exceeding one year"?

This amendment removes the issuance of building permits from the Selectmen's office and brings the ordinance into compliance with NH RSA 155-A:3.

**Article 09     Reports**

To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees.

---

**Article 10     Operating Budget**

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the budget committee recommended sum of \$678,567 for general municipal operations. This article does not include appropriations contained in special or individual articles addressed separately.  
(Majority vote required)

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**Article 11 Fund Fire Truck CRF**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000 to place into the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund established in 2011 for the future purchase of a fire truck. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

**Article 12 Fund Fire Equip CRF**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to place into the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund established in 2018 for the future purchase of fire equipment. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

---

**Article 13 Fund Prop Reval CRF**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000 to place into the Property Revaluation Capital Reserve fund established in 2001 for a future property revaluation. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

---

**Article 14 Fund Fut Cem CRF**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to place into the Future Cemetery Capital Reserve fund established in 2023 for future cemetery space. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

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**Article 15 Fund Bridge CRF**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to place into the Bridge Capital Reserve fund established in 2023 for the future maintenance, construction or reconstruction of town bridges. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

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**Article 16      Fund Highway Equio CRF**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to place into the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund established in 1992 for the future purchase of highway equipment. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

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**Article 17      Fund Town Bldg Main ETF**

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to place into the Town Building Maintenance Expendable Trust Fund established in 2018 for the purpose of repairing and maintaining the town hall, library, fire station and highway garage. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required).

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**Article 18      Increase Permit Fees**

To see if the Town will vote to change the present permit fee schedule adopted March 14, 2002 and amended March 10, 2022, consisting of \$5.00 per hundred square feet of non-living space, \$10.00 per hundred square feet of living space and a minimum fee of \$25.00 per permit, to a fee of \$0.20 per square foot for residential construction, \$0.30 per square foot for commercial construction, and a \$60 minimum fee for all permit types. (Majority vote required).

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**Article 19      By Petition**

BY PETITION: New Hampshire thrives when state funding fairly supports local communities. Therefore, the residents of Surry are asked: To see if the Town will call on the New Hampshire Legislature to protect local taxpayers by ensuring adequate state revenues for essential services, and by avoiding policies that shift costs onto local property taxpayers?

This question arises because recent state budgets have reduced or eliminated key revenue sources, forcing towns and counties to raise property taxes to maintain education, healthcare, county nursing homes, public safety, and infrastructure. These shifts burden working

families, strain local budgets, limit flexibility, and undermine long-term prosperity. A state budget that prevents cost-shifting and restores municipal revenue sharing eases the tax burden on local property taxpayers and strengthens communities.

Be it further resolved that the Select Board/Town Council shall send the results of this vote to the Governor and all members of the General Court representing Surry within 30 days.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The trust funds are managed by New Hampshire Public Deposit Investment Pool (NHPDIP) and Bar Harbor Wealth Management. The Trustees met with representatives of Bar Harbor to review the investment strategy for the school funds. Overall, we are pleased with the returns on these investments.

The Trustees work with the Cemetery Trustees on both general maintenance and perpetual care reimbursements to the Town. For 2025, the Town was reimbursed \$581.74 for general maintenance care of the trust fund lots.



**March 2026 Annual Report  
 Surry School District Officers SAU 91**

**The Annual Surry School District Business Meeting will be on Thursday, March 12, 2026, 7:00 PM at the Surry Town Hall. The Warrant Articles and the Budget are posted, in this book, and on the Surry website.**

This year is the eighteenth year of the Surry School District. As of January 1<sup>st</sup>, there are eighty-eight Surry students attending in Keene. Sixteen Surry students are tuitioned privately, four are home schooled, and fourteen attend area charter schools. These non-Keene students will save Surry about \$625,012 this year. The tuition costs vary from year to year, which are determined by family choice and Keene’s tuition rates. Surry’s birth rate seems to be declining but the number of families moving to Surry is likely to continue rising.



The educational needs of Surry students are primary focus of the Board. Keene principals report that Surry students have assimilated without issue and are doing well. The number of students needing special education services is increasing each year. In addition to students at Keene, we supply special education services to students at the charter schools, and to preschools to help children enter kindergarten level with their peers.

Surry School District is administered by Superintendent Kim Caron, Special Education Coordinator Julie Frenrich and Business Manager Jodie Hilmquist. The new administration is providing excellent service to the Board. We have approved quite a large number of policies which are posted on the school page of the town website [www.surry.nh.gov](http://www.surry.nh.gov). The annual financial audit done by CPAs at Vashon Clukay found our accounts to be in order. We also contracted with a new bus company, Student Transportation of America, for a reasonable cost.

The Surry School District is under contract with the Keene School District to send all its public school students to Keene. Families planning changes in their children’s education are encouraged

to contact the School Board ahead of time using the town website. This way the School Board can determine whether tuition due will be the responsibility of the School District or the family.

On September 2, 2025, residents approved the updated A.R.E.A. agreement with Keene, effective July 1, 2026, which guarantees our students equal access to Keene educational programs for twenty years, with the contracting towns sharing the costs equitably. It also provides the Surry District voting membership on Keene standing committees.

Inspection of the Surry School building a few years ago found that the physical structure is in good shape. However, building components are wearing out. The Board has contracted with a school architectural firm to evaluate the building facilities and to provide planning recommendations. The School Board assumes the costs of major system failures and the Surry Village Charter School assumes the costs of maintenance and utilities, as it is housed in the Surry School building rent-free.

For the safety of the children, and to protect the integrity of the school driveway, the School Board reminds residents that the school driveway is not a public road. Signs have been posted at both ends of the driveway specifying that the driveway is for school access only.

Surry residents, the Board sincerely appreciates the support you have shown us, especially in keeping the school census accurate. We welcome your input at our meetings. We meet the third Monday of the month at 7:00 PM at the Surry School building.

## Reed Free Library Board of Trustees Annual Report 2025

The current Board of Trustees, led by Chair Karyn Hagen, includes Marie T. Keller (Secretary), Lynn Zimmerman (Treasurer), Linda Collins, Julie Dutton, Becky Huntley, and Kelly Reeves. We present our 2025 report with enthusiasm to continue our work in 2026.

Our greatest highlight was providing access to NH Downloadable Books in March. Circulation rose quickly with patrons taking out many digital audiobooks, eBooks, and digital magazines held by the NH State Library. Borrowing of all book formats increased 523% after 2024 which reflects the wide variety of media patrons are seeking and can now access. It is easy to sign up, so if you have not yet, just contact the Reed Free Library. You will need a current library card so visit the library to apply if you do not have a card yet.

We also collaborated with local libraries and organizations. With Gilsum and Sullivan librarians, we offered a summer reading program titled, “Level-Up at Your Library”, developed by the non-profit organization, Illinois Reading Enrichment and Development (iRead). Planned events included a games day held in Sullivan, a “Touch-A Truck” event at the Gilsum Rock Swap, a reading contest, and an ice cream social to end the program at Sullivan Library. For Old Home Day in August we offered refreshments, held a book sale, and signed residents up for library cards. In December we organized a food collection for the Community Kitchen in Keene as more people and families are in need across the Monadnock Region.

Throughout the year we offered consistent programming. “Story Time” events were held the first Saturday of every month. In May we began offering a seed swap and in June we began crafting drop-in sessions on the first Monday of each month. In 2026 we hope to revive the reading group and more community events. The trustees engaged in a variety of activities over the past year. Members attended a Regional Trustees Gathering at the Chesterfield Library in April and the NHLTA Annual Conference in Manchester in May, to learn about current issues and best practices for libraries. Planning Board Year in Review  
2025

January: A permit for a temporary driveway for property of Francis and Karina McClaron on Joslin Road was recommended. A new driveway permit application form was reviewed and approved. A public hearing was held and a lot line adjustment between properties of Mark and Kathy Gross on Surry Dam Road and East Surry Road was approved.

February: A driveway permit application from Wayne Brown for property on Cider Mill and a driveway permit application from Mark and Kathy Gross on East Surry Road were recommended. A permit renewal application for the telecommunication tower on Valley View was approved.

March: Dave Bergeron presented a subdivision plan for preliminary consultation for property of the Warren and Arlie MacKenzie Irrevocable Trust and Mark MacKenzie off the Old Walpole Road in Keene and Surry. A public hearing was scheduled for April. John Davis spoke about changing the definition of steep slope from a 20% grade to a 15% grade and replacing our steep slope map.

April: Laryssa Hiller was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Planning Board. A hearing was held for a subdivision of a 3.77 acre lot from land owned by Mark MacKenzie and The Warren and Arlie Irrevocable Trust, to be joined with a lot located in Keene and provide road frontage for the Keene lot. Access to these lots will be from Valley View Road, a private road. The subdivision was approved with the stipulation that the Surry lot shall not be conveyed separately from the Keene lot. Bruce Smith shared his concern about development on steep, gravel roads.

May: A Public hearing was held for a lot line adjustment between properties of Mark and Kathy Gross on Surry Dam Road and East Surry Road to correct the lot line adjustment approved in January as to the side setback distances of the existing driveway. The adjustment was approved. Dave Bergeron discussed possible driveways for two existing lots owned by Mark MacKenzie on Old Walpole Road. He proposed that the driveways enter from Valley View Road rather than from Old Walpole Road due to grade and wetlands. He was referred to the Selectmen.

June: A map showing 15% slopes in Surry has been obtained. A public hearing for the Master Plan was held. Matt Goodwin as chairman of the Master Plan Committee presented the plan and after comments the Master Plan was approved by the Planning Board and will be available on the Town Website.

July: A driveway permit application for property of Sarah Cushing and Brantley Palmer on Cider Mill Lane was recommended. In conjunction with review of the Master Plan action items, Bruce Smith presented some zoning changes that he would like to see enacted.

August: A driveway permit application from Broadvest Corp. for property on Farm Road was recommended. A driveway permit application for a temporary driveway from Dean and Jonathan Dorman for property on Farm Road was recommended. A draft amendment to the zoning ordinance to increase lot size in the general zone and to change the zoning along Mine Ledge Road from rural residential to general was received for review. There was concern about the current allowable uses in the general zone.

September: The Master Plan encourages some changes in the zoning ordinance. Topics that the Planning Board should discuss include establishing a commercial or mixed-use zone along Route 12A,

allowance of a second Accessory Dwelling Unit on properties, changing the definition of steep slope to 15% grade, changing zoning along Mine Ledge Road to general, increasing lot size in the general zone to 5 acres and reducing lot size in the commercial/industrial zone to 2 acres. The table of uses for all zones should be reviewed. The board voted to change our monthly meeting date to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month.

October: Matt Goodwin reported on the numerous changes that the NH Legislature has enacted that change local zoning. The Planning Board will propose amendments to bring the zoning ordinance into compliance with state law.

November: Discussion of the amendments to the zoning ordinance that would be required to bring the ordinance into compliance with changes that the NH Legislature enacted in 2025. Publishing the Master Plan on the Town Website has not been successful yet. Nancy Balla appeared for a preliminary consultation about a lot line adjustment. Mark Ohlson appeared for a preliminary consultation about an accessory dwelling unit.

December: Final language for proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance was discussed. Proposed amendments included changing the zone along the Mine Ledge Road from rural residential to general, increasing minimum lot size and minimum dimensions in the general zone and changing the definition of steep slope to a 15% grade. These amendments were aimed to reduce potential development along steep gravel roads, class VI roads and steep back-land. Proposed amendments also included reducing the minimum required parking spaces for accessory use dwellings, allowing multi-family dwellings in the commercial/industrial zone, updating language referring to the state building code and state fire code, authorizing the building inspector to issue building permits, directing the selectmen to establish a schedule of fees for building permits and establishing expiration dates for building permits. These amendments were proposed to comply with state law. A public hearing regarding these amendments was scheduled for January 2026 at which time the board will determine which amendments will be on the Town Warrant in March.

**Surry Conservation Commission**  
**March 2026 Annual Report to the Town**

The Conservation Commission, working with the NH Department of Environmental Services (DES), the NH Aquatic Mitigation Fund (ARM), the Cheshire County Conservation District, the Army Corp of Engineers, the Monadnock Conservancy, and adjoining towns, is committed to preserving and protecting the natural environment, the flora and the fauna in Surry. One of our members serves on the Ashuelot River Local Advisory Committee (ARLAC) which is developing a river management plan. Three members served on the Surry Master Planning Committee.

The Commission has contracted with Moosewood Ecological LLC to conduct a Natural Resources Inventory, (NRI) which is required by law. The purpose is to update our fifteen-year-old maps identifying resources in water, wildlife, agriculture, forestry among other resources. This will help our town clarify what we want Surry to be in thirty years. This inventory can inform the Surry Master Plan and will be the basis of the Surry Conservation Plan.

Resources from NHGRANIT, NH Natural Heritage Bureau, Army Corps, NH Wildlife Action Plan, Surry Master Plan and Surry natural resource maps were used to identify important ecological areas to visit. With written landowner permission, several properties were visited which identified over 1000 species. Individual landowners will receive notification of rare and endangered species on their property, as this will not be in the public report. The project will conclude with a community meeting to present the findings and a digital report with maps planned for the town website.

The Commission has been working with the owners of a large tract in Walpole and Surry, and another owner in Surry, about placing their land in a conservation easement. This would keep these forested properties in their natural state to protect water and soil quality, and to promote wildlife habitat. After developing a conservation plan based on the NRI, we plan to approach other landowners to determine their interest in a Conservation Easement on their land. One member took a 6-week training on grant-writing in anticipation of applying for funds to help provide legal services for easements.

The Surry Commission is a member of the NH Association of Conservation Commissions. One of our members serves on this board. The Association has advised that state law provides a clear role for local conservation commissions to participate in environmental planning, monitoring

and law enforcement. Commission members commented on the subdivision application on Joslin Rd. which was denied by Surry and the court. The Commission also commented on the NHDOT bridge proposal for the River Road over Thompson Brook. More details will be forthcoming in April. The commission also reviews driveway applications and monitors construction work in order to protect wetlands and prevent soil erosion.

We meet the first Monday of the month, 7:00 PM, at the Surry Town Hall. All are welcome.

## 2025 Emergency Management Report

The goal of Emergency Management in the Town of Surry is local-level prevention, mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery efforts for all hazards and disasters. This includes natural disasters such as hurricanes, floods and severe winter storms, and human-caused disasters. Jason Contrady and Bruce Smith volunteer as Surry's Emergency Management Director and Deputy, respectively.

Throughout the year we develop contacts with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), New Hampshire Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM), U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), NH State Police (NHSP), Surry Village Charter School, Eversource, and other local, county, state, and national agencies and organizations.

This year Jason attended "Straightforward Grant Writing" presented by Suzanne Bansley at Cheshire County for county nonprofits and municipalities. Grants are an important funding source which can provide significant resources to enhance the town's ability to provide services and activities not otherwise available with taxpayer money.

Bruce met with local Emergency Management Directors from Cheshire and Hillsborough counties and NH HSEM in Concord.

### Hazard Mitigation Plan

Next year, 2026, it is time to update the Town of Surry's local Hazard Mitigation Plan. This plan is revised every 5 years, with our last update during 2021. Please contact Jason Contrady, Bruce Smith, or a member of the Selectboard if you have interest in participating.

FEMA requires, in 44 CFR Part 201, approved mitigation plans for local governments to be eligible for projects funded under Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) and other FEMA programs. Additionally, Public Assistance funding is available to implement mitigation measures for damaged eligible facilities to protect against future damages. Mitigation plans must be reviewed and updated every five years and formally adopted by each participating jurisdiction's governing body as part of receiving approval.

Surry is fortunate to be awarded a 75% grant this year through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to contract with a planning agency assisting with updates to our Hazard Mitigation Plan. This update project can be seen proposed in the town budget as an appropriation and offsetting source of revenue.

The updated plan will address mitigation of multiple natural hazards that may affect the community, including Avalanche, Coastal Flooding, Inland Flooding, Drought, Earthquake, Extreme Temperatures, High Wind Events, Landslide, Lightning, Severe Winter Weather, Solar Storms and Space Weather, Tropical and Post-Tropical Cyclones, and Wildfires.

### Hazard Mitigation Plan Update Process

Surry Emergency Management will convene a local Hazard Mitigation Planning Team. Members should include a cross-section of the community, such as residents, government officials, community leaders and business owners. This team will serve as a liaison to the vendor and assist in the plan update by providing access to relevant local data, facilitating community input on plan recommendations and priorities, reviewing draft products, and assisting with outreach to community stakeholders. With the vendor's facilitation and technical assistance, the Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee will:

- Hold a minimum of two community public meetings during the planning process update, one during the production of the plan update, and one during the review of the draft plan.
- Solicit input from key stakeholders in the community, including business associations, local or regional institutions, local NGO's, and residents.
- Conduct local outreach to stakeholders through postings on the municipal web site, and outreach to local print and/or online press.
- Outreach to neighboring communities.
- Provide input regarding the feasibility and prioritization of mitigation measures
- Review the draft plan update and its goals and proposed mitigation projects
- Revisit the Hazard Profiles for each Hazard that impacts the community.
- Update the description and prioritization of the natural hazards that have occurred within the community since the last plan update.
- Assess our the community's vulnerability to identified hazards
- Update an inventory of critical facilities
- Set mitigation goals

# Surry Fire Department 2025 Engineer's Report




February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026

During 2025, Surry responded to several significant incidents, including a fully involved house fire on Hallwood Drive and a well-involved garage fire on Pond Road (see photo on the next page). Surry units also responded as mutual aid to several significant fires in Keene, Alstead, and Acworth. Due to the recent progression in our department, we are seeing an increase in requests from Surry by our mutual aid partners to their communities. We are proud to be a part of a robust mutual aid system and gladly reciprocate these calls.

Surry remains unique in that we are still 100% volunteer. It is the 25 familiar faces of your neighbors offering comfort while answering all calls for service and mitigating emergencies.

## Grants

We are very fortunate in 2025 to be awarded a grant of \$288,000 through FEMA's Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) for a new brush truck! The AFG grant will be matched using funds already in the Capital Reserve Fund. Engine 3, our 1978 Mini-Pumper currently used as our brush truck, has served the town extremely well over its 47-year lifespan. The capabilities of a new purpose-built Type V wildland brush truck will allow our Fire Department to protect remote areas of town inaccessible to on-road vehicles. Delivery is estimated to be late 2027.



**Informational and Community Services**

Our 2 CPR instructors using the set of CPR training manikins purchased last year handle SVFD in-house CPR certification for the membership and offer CPR training classes available to the community. Contact [CPR@surrynhfire.org](mailto:CPR@surrynhfire.org) for more information.

The Fire Station is also a Car seat Safety Inspection Site. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death and injuries in children. Properly used car seats decrease the risk of fatal injury by 71% among infants and 54% among toddlers. Booster seats reduce the risk of nonfatal injuries by 45% among four- to eight-year olds. Child Passenger Safety Technicians (CPSTs) educate caregivers on how to correctly transport children in their care. CPSTs provide personalized instruction about how to correctly install a car seat in a vehicle, as well as how to correctly secure a child in the car seat. This is a free service open to all caregivers (parents, grandparents, babysitters) who are residents and non-residents. This program is in partnership with the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA), the National Child Passenger Safety Board (NCPSTB), and Safe Kids Worldwide.

Thank you for allowing me to take this opportunity to provide a report to the Surry Selectboard regarding the calls for service that the State Police have responded to in your community during the last year. ## Ashuelot River Local Advisory Committee 2025 Annual Report

**ARLAC** members met monthly to discuss permits, projects and concerns along the river corridor. We involved the community with the monthly water quality monitoring program and annual river cleanup. We participated in educational opportunities to learn about rule and procedural changes from the State of NH.

**PERMITS:** ARLAC members carefully reviewed plans for Shoreland (SL), Wetland (WL), Alteration of Terrain (AOT) and Permit by Notification (PBN). Each project was followed through the permitting process.

- Washington: Dam Bureau Permit: Ashuelot Pond Dam Village District, support overtopping protections. SL: McKinley Drive garage (permitted 9/5/25). SL PBN: seasonal dock, pervious patio. WL: Anson (permitted 10/7/25). SL: Donoghue (pending).
- Marlow: NH DOT (NH Dept. of Transportation) Fuel tank replacement. Comment in favor of above ground tanks vs underground. SL permitted with modifications 10/10/25. .
- Keene: AOT & WL: Monadnock Conservancy (permitted 8/29/25). AST: Corning. AOT: Fairfield KIA (permitted 10/27/25). SL, WL: Guitard Homes (SL permitted 7/1/25); WL (permitted 9/4/25). AOT: Guitard Homes (pending). Special pesticide permit: NH DOT. Comment in favor of pesticide alternatives.
- Swanzey/Keene: PBN: Eversource ROW (Right of Way) vegetative maintenance. WL & AOT: Eversource lines T198. WL(permitted 8/9/25); AOT(permitted 8/20)
- Hinsdale: Type 1-B Permit Modification: Solar array adjacent to landfill (pending). Comment in favor.

## PROJECTS/ISSUES

- Swanzey: erosion issues at campground and town land. Follow progress of rehabilitation efforts.
- Marlow Hydro: follow progress of FERC (Federal Energy Regulatory Commission) RFMI (Request For More Information)
- Fiske Mill, Ashuelot: follow progress of decommissioning.
- Ashuelot Hydro: follow issue of ramping river flow. Discussion involves several agencies. Comments to FERC.
- Winchester: Lost Road seepage: Site visit, involve DES
- Keene State College: Student biomonitoring projects, consultation and attend presentations.
- Swanzey: Winchester St. CWSRF (Clean Water State Revolving Fund) applications and environmental review. Comment in support.
- iNaturalist: set up site for citizens to post findings along the river corridor.
- Emergency debris removal: Swanzey & Keene Airport shoreland. Encourage City to take this on but ultimately work is done by volunteers.
- Swanzey CWSRF application: Wastewater Treatment Plant solar array. We support.
- Keene: Emerald Street: Stormwater pipe rehabilitation. We support.
- Keene: CWSRF: New wastewater pump stations at Tanglewood Estates. We support.

- Winchester: CWSRF: Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrades. We support.
- Swanzy: Host Franklin Pierce University student river site visit.
- River monitoring: 19 volunteers complete monthly testing May-Sept. Meets state Class B standards for Dissolved oxygen, total phosphorous, chloride, turbidity and E.coli; pH remains below acceptable standards; specific conductance reflects moderate to high impact in Keene and downstream in July – Sept. especially with the drought conditions.
- Swanzy Uncovered: article about iNaturalist initiative.
