SELECTMEN

MEETING MINUTES MAY 4, 2026

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. Present were Jay Croteau, Steve Goldsmith and Ron Profaizer. No meeting Memorial day May 25, 2026.

Melissa Young received townhall key for cleaning. Request to supply cleaning supplies.

The selectmen signed payroll.

The selectmen signed and paid bills.

The selectmen signed EFTPS payment.

Steve Goldsmith motioned to accept the minutes. Ron Profaizer seconded the motion. The selectmen agreed to accept the minutes.

Garret Walsh spoke with the selectmen about 2 culverts on Cider Mill Rd. and the need to clean the ditch lines of both the large culvert the brook empties into as well as the smaller second culvert. The selectmen will contact Durwin Clark and set up an inspection date for midweek.

Jay Croteau contacted Stephonson of 31 Wilber Rd. No permit needed for fence close to property line.

Steve Goldsmith met with Dean Dorman and accepted the plans supplied. Received septic plans as well. LUCT has gone to Avitar.

Jay Croteau motioned to pay Gemini half down deposit for parking lot paving and apron on Pond Rd. Steve Goldsmith seconded the motion. The selectmen agreed.

Jay Croteau reported All State Paving of Old Walpole Road will be scheduled for June.

Jay Croteau will contact Frank Lucuis by phone to order fabric for Farm Rd.

Mutual Aid Telecon line 1 fault for town hall. Josh Brooks, John Berglund and Jay Croteau notified. Scheduled to clear and reset for midnight.

Ordinance folder not printed yet.

Steve Goldsmith installed new motion detector porch lights. He will correct middle light.

Bruce Smith will forward excel financial information to Ron Profaizer for NHDPIP deposit transfer.

Joslin Rd culverts reviewed with plan to have Durwin Clark clean them.

Highway department to begin raking gravel roads.

Tree limb before Joslin Rd bridge to be removed.

Meeting at Cider Mill Road Garrett Walsh culverts.

Building permit #1722 for Dean Dorman First ck #898 for \$110 and second check reflecting new fees ck # 890460 for \$210.00. Total fees \$310.00. For construction of steel building with indoor apartment.

Town Garage has just phone with Consolidated.

The selectmen reviewed Retention Policy for town per RSA 33- A and destruction of records. See policy for more information.

Bruce Smith volunteered to update NH DOT survey for roads. Note not all class VI roads are documented.

The Town of Surry received information for HMPG #4799 Hazard mitigation plan. Next step is to contact Henry Underwood at SWRPC . Bruce Smith volunteered to respond.

Received Liberty Utilities PA81 values for 2026 forwarded to Avitar. Also forwarded Eversource PA 81.

The DES has re activated the Surry Mountain Picnic area drinking water at the beach area.

Bruce Smith volunteered to fill out Community Profile.

The selectmen reviewed the 2025 Equalized Valuations from DRA.

The Town of Surry received State of New Hampshire Highway Block grant for \$5286.08 and SB 367 for \$720.38 for a total check of \$6006.46.

The selectmen reviewed draft version of selectboard overview

Steve Goldsmith forwarded energy audit information to Tim Peloquin for the Surry School Board.

Hammond building permit #1723 for building demolition. The Town of Surry received \$60.00 cash. Note to remove from tax card for 2027.

Ron Profazier will email Nicole Conroy about removing the camera on the London Road on the town right of way.

Discussion of third curb cut on the Mine Ledge Rd with questions about line of sight. Continue monitoring. No action.

The speed limit sign continues to supply valid data on the Pond Rd. 86% of cars monitored are at or below 35 MPH, fastest time up the hill was 54 MPH, and average day count was 65 vehicles. The sign continues to record data.

Building Inspector Steve Goldsmith received request to sign off on Mackenzie permit.

Building Inspector Steve Goldsmith inspected Surry Village Charter School bathroom remodel. Timely notification of inspections stages were not adhered to.

Ron Profazier motioned to adjourn. Steve Goldsmith seconded the motion. The selectmen agreed to adjourn.
